

2008 SPRING FISH SALE

**PICKUP**

Pickup will be **TUESDAY, APRIL 22, 2008, starting at 2:00 p.m.** at the Huron County Fairgrounds. Enter at the main gate and follow the signs to the Agronomy Building. **ORDERS MUST BE PICKED UP AT THE SPECIFIED TIME.** If you have any questions concerning the fish sale, stocking rates, or delivery, please call the District office at 419-668-4113 ext. #3.

If you have purchased fish, you will need to **bring your own container half filled** (over filled containers will be poured out) with fresh pond water (city water CANNOT be used because it has been chemically treated). A five gallon container will transport 100 fingerlings, two white Amur, or 300 minnows. Each container should be lined with a clean garbage bag prior to filling with water. When filled with fish, the bags will be injected with oxygen and tied shut for transport.

**STOCKING**

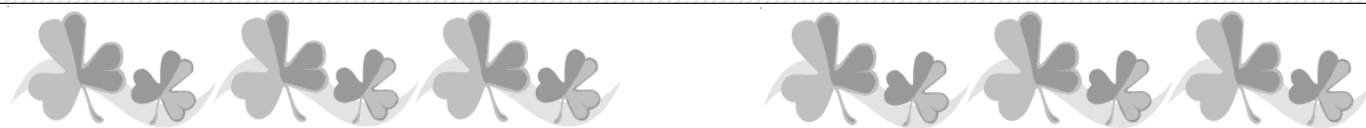
When Stocking Bluegill, Yellow Perch, or Redear Sunfish, total stocking should not exceed 500 per pond surface acre.
