A 2/3 transplant has spent two years in a seedling bed and three years in a transplant bed. These have excellent survival when given good weed and grass control, and they are easy to plant. **First Come, first serve. Order while supplies last!** The pickup location is as it has been the last few years behind our office in the new pole building located at 8 Fair Road in Norwalk, OH. 2023 SPRING SEEDLING INFORMATION

	<p>Fraser Fir <i>(Abies fraseri)</i></p>	<p>Often called Southern Balsam Fir. Grows 40 to 60 feet in height with a spread of 20 to 25 feet. Very soft, shiny, dark green foliage is silver on the underside. Likes cool, moist, well drained soil. Will not do well in heavy, wet, clay soil. Does not require full sun. Needs only light shearing. THE BEST CHRISTMAS TREE, with good needle retention. Designated the “Cadillac of Christmas Trees”.</p>
	<p>Eastern White Pine <i>(Pinus strobus)</i></p>	<p>Fast growing 90 to 100 feet. Spread 25 to 40 feet. A five needled pine, with soft, light green-blue needles, 4 inches long. Can tolerate dry, rocky soil. Grows in normal moisture conditions but can tolerate wet, swampy areas. Excellent ornamental tree for specimens, naturalizing, windbreak or dense screen. Can be easily restrained to manageable height by pruning. For screen or Christmas trees, shear when new growth appears. It is easily controlled, and is good for small properties as well as field plantings. Also widely used for Christmas trees and timber</p>
	<p>Lynwood Gold Forsythia <i>(Forsythia Intermedia)</i></p>	<p>Very fast, upright growth to 7 feet; spread of 5 feet. One of the best plants for fast flowering screen. Deep golden flowers, early spring, more thickly and evenly distributed along the stems than other Forsythia. Ordinary to poor soil. Plant in full sun. Can withstand adverse city conditions. This plant can easily be pruned, after blooming, to maintain desired height and will bloom better next year. For hedge, plant 4 feet apart.</p>
	<p>Swamp White OAK <i>(Quercus bicolor)</i></p>	<p>Grows to 50 to 60 feet in height and spread. Has a broad, open rounded crown. Does well in wet, swampy conditions along rivers and streams. Excellent choice for wetland plantings. Fall color is yellow-bronze.</p>
	<p>American Sycamore <i>(Platanus occidentalis)</i></p>	<p>Also known as American Planetree. A massive shade tree, growing 75 to 100 feet with a similar or greater spreading crown. Bark peels in thin, irregular patches giving a white appearance to the trunk. Likes moist soil and does well along streams.</p>
	<p>Eastern Redcedar <i>(Juniperus virginiana)</i></p>	<p>A dense pyramidal evergreen growing to 40 to 50 feet. Spread 8 to 20 feet. Medium green needles are flat and scale-like. Ex-foliating handsome grayish to reddish brown bark is considered part of its ornamental interest. Native from northern Florida to Canada and west to the Rocky Mountains. Should grow in almost any soil and does well in poor gravelly soils. Due to its fast, dense growth, this tree is a good choice for an evergreen screen or hedge, space 4 feet apart.</p>

2023 SPRING FISH SALE

The prepaid fish order deadline is April 4, 2023. The pickup is 2:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. Tuesday April 11, 2023 in the parking lot of our building located at 8 Fair Road, Norwalk, OH. Please arrive no later than 2:30 p.m. for pickup.

Bring buckets (5 gallon pails work great) lined with *unscented* poly trash bags, 1/3 filled with water from the pond that your are going to stock. Do not use lids. Fenders Fish Hatchery will inject oxygen in the bags and tie the bag with twine for transport.

A five gallon bucket will transport 100 small fish, four to five large fish, or 1,000 minnows.

Black Crappie	Stocked in many lakes and reservoirs around Ohio; close to surface at dawn; prefer stony or hard bottom to lay eggs	Feed on fish and insects	100 per acre along with bass and bluegill; restocked every 3 to 5 years	12" to 14"
