








Transplants are bareroot plants that have had their root system pruned and planted back in the ground. This greatly increases the survival when again dug and planted. A 3/3 transplant has spent three years in a seedling bed and three years in a transplant bed. These have excellent survival when given good weed and grass control, and they are easy to plant. **First Come, first serve. Order while supplies last!** The pickup location is as it has been the last few years behind our office in the new pole building located at 8 Fair Road in Norwalk, OH. 2024 SPRING SEEDLING INFORMATION

	Frasier Fir <i>(Abies fraseri)</i>	<p>Frasier Firs probably are best known as a favorite ornamental or Christmas tree with proper watering. It is a slow growing evergreen, reaching 30' to 40' in height and 20' to 25' spread. Cones are 1 1/2" to 2 1/2". It prefers a moist, well drained loam and sun or partial shade.</p>
	Norway Spruce <i>(Picea abies)</i>	<p>This pyramidal, pendulous branched evergreen grows between 40' and 60' in height and by 25' to 30' spread. It is considered medium to fast growing. It bears 4" to 6" long cones. It performs well in moist, sandy, acidic, well drained soils in full sun to very light shade. It is commonly used as a windbreak.</p>
	Nannyberry <i>(Viburnum lentago)</i>	<p>Nannyberry is a shrub or small tree towards 25' in height which works well in shrub borders. In May, white, creamy flowers appear followed by droopy, oval bluish black fruit beginning in September and sometimes lasting until December. The fruit provides good food for the birds in the winter. Nannyberries have a medium growth rate, and they are adaptable to a wide range of conditions from sun or shade to moist or dry soils.</p>
	Eastern Redbud <i>(Cercis canadensis)</i>	<p>For many years, this is the seedling preferred for our Annual 2nd Grade Arbor Day Program. It has a medium growth rate, growing to 20' to 30' in height with a 25' to 35' spread. It is a small tree producing rosy pink to purplish flowers in March to April. Young seedlings should be planted in moist, well drained clay, loam or sandy soils and in full sun to partial shade.</p>
	Common Lilac <i>(Syringa vulgaris)</i>	<p>This broad, oval leafed shrub reminds us of Grandmas with its fragrant flowers in mid May. Its mature height is 8' to 15', while its spread is 6' to 12'. It is best grown in loamy clay, loam, sandy loam, sandy soil, while preferring full sun. It is inviting to song birds and bees.</p>
	Whitespire Birch <i>(Betula populifolia)</i>	<p>This is a narrow, pyramidal, white barked tree. Leaves turn yellow in the fall. The mature height is between 40' and 50' with a mature spread of 15' to 25'. This medium growing tree prefers loamy clay, loam, and sandy loam soils, but it tolerates moist, wet soils. Sun exposure should be partial to full sun. It can be used in wetland restorations.</p>
	Dawn Redwood <i>(Metasequoia glyptostrobies)</i>	<p>This is a fast growing tree maturing in height 70' to 100' with a 25' to 50' spread. The Dawn Redwood turns reddish brown in the fall. While this tree prefers full sun, it can grow in a range of soil types from loam, loamy clay, to sandy loam. It is an excellent ornamental tree in landscaping.</p>

Perch	Found in Lake Erie and impoundments, ponds, slow moving rivers throughout Ohio. Prefer clear water with moderate vegetation	Adult aquatic insects and larvae, and small fishes	100 per acre (need brush piles and screen overflow to protect perch)	5" to 12"
White Amur	Rapidly moving waters or where adequate food supply exists	Leafy, aquatic plants such as pondweed, coontail, floating duckweed, and cattails	Vegetation: <i>Light:</i> 3 to 5 amurs per acre <i>Moderate:</i> 6 to 10 amurs per acre <i>Heavy:</i> 11 to 15 amurs per acre	3' to 5' long and up to 100 lbs.
Japanese Koi	Originated in 18th century Japan; Popular in USA for 50 years	Duckweed and water-mill	10 to 12 per acre	8" to 9"
Redear Sunfish (shellcracker)	Not native to Ohio; found primarily in clear, warm waters with vegetation	Snails and other mollusks, crayfish, insects, insect larvae, and small fish	250 per acres + 250 bluegill per acre	9" to 11"

The prepaid, order deadline is April 2, 2024. The pickup is 2:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. Tuesday April 9, 2024 in the parking lot of our building located at 8 Fair Road, Norwalk, OH. Please arrive no later than 2:30 p.m. for pickup of the presold fish for pond stocking.

Bring buckets (5 gallon pails work great) lined with *unscented* poly trash bags, 1/3 filled with water from the pond that your are going to stock. Do not use lids. Fenders Fish Hatchery will inject oxygen in the bags and tie the bag with twine for transport.

A five gallon bucket will transport 100 small fish, four to five large fish, or 1,000 minnows.
